KANSAS 4-H AND VANIER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

2024-25 Kansas 4-H Scholarships are due March 1, 2025 by 11:59 pm CST.

The scholarship process for State 4-H Scholarships and the Vanier Family Scholarship Program has been streamlined. This process has been designed to encourage more 4-H'ers to apply for these scholarships by simplifying and combining the process. Evaluation criteria has also been included to provide transparency throughout the entire process. Please note several of the larger changes listed below:

- 1. Applicants will provide a cover letter and resume as part of their application—the same resume may be used for both scholarship processes. Applicants are encouraged to have a separate clover letter for the State 4-H Scholarships from the Vanier Family Scholarship Pro-
- 2. Evaluation materials are provided to increase the transparency of the process.
- 3. References do NOT submit a letter of recommendations—they will be asked to answer several short answer questions about the applicant. These questions can be found on Kansas 4-H website: https://www.kansas4h.org/resources/awards-and-recognition/ scholarships.html

Horse Panorama

4– H Horse Panorama will be held February 22-23 at Rock Springs, near Junction City. The 4-H Horse Panorama is a compilation of state contests (Hippology, Horse Bowl, Public Speaking, Demonstration/Illustrated Talks, Photography, Educational Poster, Ad/Layout Design) that encourages young people to expand their knowledge of equine-related subject matter. The contests develop alertness, self-confidence, and knowledge in a competitive setting, surrounded by an attitude of friendliness and fairness. The state contests are open to youth whose 4-H age is 9-18. A noncompetitive first-timers event, will be open to beginners to immerse them in

the contest experience. Horse Panorama is the qualifying event which the Kansas representatives for to the national contests (Hippology, Horse Bowl, Public Speaking, Demonstration/Illustrated Talks) are chosen. Registration information will be released in mid-December.

Pending Private Pesticide Applicator Changes in 2025

Starting in 2025, extension offices will no longer offer the open book testing option for KDA private pesticide applicator licenses. I have received recent communications (12/20) stating this change may not start in January, but a change is coming at some point in 2025. It is unclear how the previous administration's EPA rules will effect pesticides in 2025. The new options will be closed book, in-person trainings, and online options only. Again, you will still be able to renew at any Extension office just via a closed book testing option beginning at some point in 2025. Commercial pesticide licenses will remain being tested in Topeka, KS.

Please call ahead to check extension office hours at 785-985-3623, and allow 2-3 hours to take the exam. We only accept checks for payment to Kansas Dept of Agriculture.

What to Do with the Christmas Tree After Christmas

After the holidays, many municipalities allow cut Christmas trees to be placed curbside. Trees are then collected and burned or ground up for mulch. If you miss the designated date, or your trash collector doesn't accept trees, there are several options to maximize the use of the tree.

An old Christmas tree can be used to benefit birds and fish. Placing it in the landscape provides shelter for birds. Sinking your Christmas tree in a pond is an easy way to improve fish habitats. The tree serves as a reef, as the branches provide substrate for water plants to grow and cover for minnows and other forms of small aquatic life. Larger fish are drawn by the shade and the presence of prey.

Kansas Forest Service Spring Sale Begins Jan 2nd

The Kansas Forest Service's annual Spring Sale will begin receiving orders on January 2nd through April 30th. There is no price increase this year. Evergreens are sold as containerized seedlings or bare root bundles. Shrubs and deciduous trees are bare root bundle only. Eastern pollinator shrub bundles are known to sell out quickly, so please put your order in early.

HYPERTENSION AWARENESS AND PREVENTION PROJECT (HAPp)
Self-Monitored Blood Pressure and Nutrition Education

What is HAPp?
HAPp blends the American Heart
Association awareness campaigns with
CC Healthy Heart Ambassador Blood
Pressure Self-Monitoring Program. HAPp
will include blood pressure and nutrition
education.

HAPp Extension agents (Kathy Tharman) are trained Healthy Heart Ambassador coaches who close the loop on referrals by encouraging participants to share blood pressure readings with their healthcare team.

Participants use blood pressure tracking to inform lifestyle change.

HAPp Extension programs offer walk-in office hours in convenient and accessible locations (Doniphan Extension office).

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

*Age 18 or older

*Hypertension diagnose or on antihypertensive medicine

*Interest in and readiness for the program

All HAPp activities are conducted by a KSRE agent trained as a Healthy Heart Ambassador Coach.

GOALS:

*improve hypertension health literacy
*become advocates for their own health
*Help participants to make connections
between lifestyle/behavior and their blood
pressure readings.

*Connect with community resources
*Cooperate with their providers for blood
pressure readings.

Stay Strong Stay Healthy Program March 18th - May 8th, 2025

I will be starting a new Spring class for Stay Strong Stay Healthy, Aging Adults.

What is Clostridium perfringens?

Clostridium perfringens bacteria are one of the most common causes of foodborne illness. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates these bacteria cause nearly 1 million illnesses in the United States every year.

With soup season upon us, these large batches of thick hot food can be trouble. If the soup is not held above 140°F or not chilled to below 40°F in small batches, then the potential for C. perfringens growth increases.

If this bacteria makes spores, which act like a protective coating to help bacteria survive, and food held between 40-140°F will allow the bacteria to grow. It can produce a toxin which can cause foodborne illness symptoms such as diarrhea.

Illness can occur within 6 to 24 hours after eating contaminated food.

Prevention steps include cooking soups, whole roasts and whole poultry to safe temperatures. Keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold. Refrigerate leftovers, divided into shallow containers, within two hours after cooking. Reheat leftovers to 165°F before serving.

Slow cookers work well to keep soup at safe temperatures.
