Upcoming Private Pesticide Applicator Changes in January 2025

Please consider checking and re-certifying private pesticide applicator your certification by December 31st. There will be updates to how this examination will be conducted at local K-State Extension Offices beginning in 2025. This is due to the objectives outlined in the Kansas house bill 2607, which was approved by the legislature earlier this year. Beginning in January 2025, there will be no longer be an open book examination option available to private pesticide applicators. The three options in order to be certified will be:

- Closed-book examination (still offered at your local extension office, but there will be new rules, which need to followed)
- Attend an in-person training to obtain certification
- Complete online training

There will be more information to follow this update on how the in-person and online trainings conducted. will be These certifications remain usable for 5 years until expiration. Again, this is only for private pesticide applicator licensing that will remain being conducted at your local extension office. If you need help determining your private pesticide applicator certification id number or
